### Archaeology Trail - Saturday, August 17th , 2pm - 5pm

**Leader**: Andrew Milne. Walking grade: moderate. Equipment: please bring a torch if you have one Meeting point and parking: Darwin Gardens car park


#### Heritage Walk: Archaeology - Saturday, September 14th , 2pm - 4.30pm


